# **UPCOMING MEETINGS**

#### Sunday, Apr. 26 at – Featured Speaker: Anne Cleeland

At **2:00 p.m.**, our Writer's Forum topic will be: "Research for Writers: How much is too much?" Writers frequently have to dig a little deeper into a subject matter in order to make their stories believable. But how do you know you have enough information, or when you need to look further? We'll discuss the difference between thorough research and a trip down the rabbit hole.

At **3:00 p.m.**, our meeting will feature guest speaker Anne Cleeland, author of the New Scotland Yard series, featuring Chief Inspector Acton and first year detective Kathleen Doyle. He's a British lord; she is Irish and of modest means. They're the stars of three books, including the just-out *Murder in Hindsight*. The previous titles in the series, which debuted in 2013, are *Murder in Thrall* and *Murder in Retribution*.

A native Southern California, Cleeland is a member of the California State Bar who previously worked as a research attorney. She will discuss the hows and whys of writing a British-set mystery. We'll also get her to talk about the Regency-era titles she has authored.







May 31, 2015 -- Featured Speaker: Colin Cotterill

**Please Note:** The May meeting will be held one week later than originally announced, and an hour earlier. It is now scheduled for Sunday, May 31, and we will get started at 1 p.m. with our Readers' Forum.

At **1:00 p.m.**, our Readers Forum topic will be: "Armchair Travel for Readers: We'll discuss mysteries set in foreign lands and their appeal. Where do our members like to go for a good story?"

At **2:00 p.m.**, our guest speaker, **Colin Cotterill**, will discuss *Six and a Half Deadly Sins*, the ninth and latest title in his popular Dr. Siri Paiboun series. Dr. Paiboun is the retired coroner of Laos; the books are set in the 1970s. This is one of two series by Cotterill, who also writes the Jimm Juree crime novels set in southern Thailand.

Born in London, Cotterill holds dual British and Australian citizenships. He is a former teacher whose work in Southeast Asia led him to take up the cause of combating child prostitution and pornography. (He has written several books about the topic.) Also a cartoonist, he lives with his family on the Gulf of Siam.

## **MEETING ROUNDUP**

The topic for out March meeting was *What's Love Got to do with It?* as we welcomed romance writers **Lisa Kessler** and **Beth Yarnell**. Lisa writes dark paranormal fiction, including the "Night Series" and the "Moon Series," and Beth's books include *Dyed and Gone – An Azalea March Mystery*, about a hairstylist/amateur sleuth, and *A Deep and Dark December*. Both women are funny and entertaining and were happy to share their knowledge of writing in general and romance writing in particular.

Beth and Lisa discussed ways to keep a romantic series fresh, admitting it can be tricky to find the right balance between not boring longtime readers with too many background details and not confusing new readers with references to previous books. Both women participated in the writers' forum, where we talked about some of our favorite sleuths; what happens to sexual tension when the two main characters finally get together; the importance of an emotional connection; and the need for male writers to use female beta readers to "get it right." And we learned the cardinal rule of the romance genre: Your protagonist must have an HEA (Happily Ever After) ending, or, at the very least, an HFN (Happy For Now) ending.
