We had a great speaker in June. Alexandra Sokoloff joined us for our Writer's Forum, "Are you a Plotter or Pantser?" We shared our thoughts on the subject and then Alexandra gave us her winning formula, gleaned from many years writing screenplays. She explained the three-act, eight-sequence structure commonly used in films and TV. Just as viewers expect a climax every fifteen minutes or so, readers expect some sort of cliffhanger or climax spaced throughout the novel. A screenwriter for ten years, Alexandra has written three books on the subject. She also has many helpful posts on her blog, http://www.screenwritingtricks.com/, including a breakdown of the popular film Silence of the Lambs.

Alex mentioned her need to reinvent herself every few years in this changing climate of publishing. She discussed traditional vs. self-publishing and clued us in on audio books, ebooks, and how persistence and drive count more than talent when it comes to getting books published. She is the author of the Thriller Awardnominated Huntress series, which has been optioned for television. She enjoys turning serial killer and woman as victim tropes inside out.
