M<u>EETING ROUNDUP</u>

Our November meeting was all about the chapter's authormembers.

President Gayle Carline, author of books including the Peri Minneopa mystery series, moderated a panel featuring Jill Amadio, Seamus Beirne, Greta Boris, Donna Lear and Cynthia Weitz, who discussed their respective books, their writing process, their road to publication and more.

Here's a sampling of what we learned:

-- Jill Amadio, a veteran journalist and ghost writer, was turned down by a slew of agents when she first tried to sell

"Digging Too Deep," the debut book in her mystery series featuring Tosca Trevant, the British gossip columnist from Cornwall now living on a Southern California island that sounds a lot like Balboa Island. Undaunted, Amadio got hold of a list of small presses and sent the manuscript out herself.

One notable publisher turned the book down because it included swear words. ("Even though they were in Cornish," Amadio quipped). The publisher also balked over the appearance of a dead animal (a squirrel), fearing it could be viewed as animal cruelty. ("Even though it's already dead when it's discovered," explained Amadio. Moreover, it plays a role in the mystery!) Luckily for Amadio, she found a taker in Mainly Murder Press, which published "Digging Too Deep" in 2014. The follow-up, "Digging up the Dead," came out early this year.

- -- Seamus Beirne's 2015 historical thriller, "Breakout from Sugar Island" (Fireship Press) is based on a true story: in the 17th Century, Cromwell sent 60,000 Irish to the island of Barbados, where they were enslaved. Born in Ireland, Beirne came to the U.S. as a teenager. He planned to join the priesthood, but wound up getting an education and becoming a high school teacher and administrator. His first writings were opinion pieces in the Los Angeles Times.
- -- Greta Boris utilized her expertise as a fitness expert and wellness coach to author the Amazon Kindle bestseller, "The Wine and Chocolate Workout." The director of the online community, O.C. Writers (ocwriters.network), she participated in a Twitter pitch session to land a publisher for the first titles in her new 7 Deadly Sins domestic suspense series. Fawkes Press plans a June 2017 publication of "A Margin of Lust"; the second title, "The Scent of Wrath," is anticipated for December 2017.
- -- **Donna Lear** mined a real life family mystery in "Crimson Gold" (2013), which she published as a novella.







Set in 1939, in the Dutch Hills of Alaska, the book is a fictionalized account of a case that involved murder, gold mining and greed. "I had these family letters that talked about what had happened," recalls Lear, who traveled to Alaska to further explore the mystery.

She is now at work on a follow-up book, set 30 years later.

-- Cynthia Weitz started writing after taking a creative writing class through the Saddleback College Emeritus Institute. But the real inspiration came after she read "Pen on Fire: A Busy Woman's Guide to Igniting the Writer Within" (Mariner Books) by Barbara DeMarco-Barrett, a member of O.C. SinC who hosts a well-known O.C. literary salon, and a radio program (on KUCI 88.9 FM) about writers. Weitz went on to pen and publish "Feisty Old Ladies" – about a glamorous and sexy senior socialite who turns sleuth. This after taking a tumble (in her Jimmy Choos) and winding up in a rehab center, where a mystery unfolds.

A sequel to the 2014 book is in the works: "Feisty Old Gangbusters" will be set in a fictionalized city that locals will recognize as Santa Ana.

Up until November, the chapter's monthly gatherings for 2016 have focused on guest authors and editors, as well as experts in various areas of criminal justice. "So it was great to have an opportunity to get to know our own authors, and their books," enthused Carline.
